

The Dryden Family and friends have a lost true character.


Fred was born at 86 grams and Hope hand fed him for two weeks. He would not give up. This character stayed with Fred throughout his life.

He did us proud in the show ring and if Robyn and I knew more about handling he would have done even better he was well awarded at both the Sydney and Melbourne Royals and the STC and the STVC specialty shows. He was part of the Robscott team to win the Strathbogie Trophy at Sydney Royal 3 times. A trophy awarded to breeder since 1966 it has been awarded to 7 breeders with only 3 winning the trophy more than once. The Robscott's are proud to have won it 3 times. The Trophy is not awarded annually. The breeder must earn it!



Darle Hecke, Scottish Terrier specialist from Canada, judged at the STCV 60th Anniversary Show and had this to say about Fred with was awarded Best in Show.

"This strong brindle dog of excellent type with a classical outline showing good proportion. He is low and deep, his head to neck to back proportions are correct. He has good bone and substance and shows good fore-chest and rear shelf. He has good rib shape and length which comes well back into compact lion. He has good layback of shoulder, reasonable length of upper arm, good rear angles with a short hock and nice Croup with good tail set. His head is of good length and correct proportion of muzzle to skull. His muzzle is well filled under the eye and he has a good underjaw. He has nice eye colour, shape and placement and ears of good size and shape which he is used well. He has





The other International Judge we should thank is Fred Stephens of Glenby who is judged at the STC 70th Anniversary October Championship Show. At Fred's first show, Fred Stephens awarded him Best Baby Puppy. It was Fred's first show. We had another adorable Puppy, Albert the show and Fred Stephens went over them after the show to help us determine who we would keep. A great choice.

Fred's last show was in 2014 at the STC October Championship Show. The Judge, Mr Ross Hall (NZ) Awarded Fred Best in Show.

Fred was the ultimate show dog. He was the first Scottie to be awarded Supreme Champion (exceeding 10 Best in Group or Best in Specialty Show and 1000 championship points)

At home, Fred was the leader of the pack. Every week or so he would climb onto Geoff's lap and survey his pack (Bit like that scene from the Lion King). Nothing was ever said but the clear message was I am the boss. Even with 4 males Fred was never challenged for Top Dog!

He spent his final days moving from the lounge to warm pavers outside. A tough life fitting this champion. Fred's heath suddenly deteriorated and he passed away last weekend.





Fred was a unique character and will be remembered forever. There will never be another Fred.

Those who knew him at the shows will fondly remember his nick-name. This is the Fred they will remember.

Festive Rice Salad with Pomegranate and Mint

Some of the members who attended the Christmas Party asked for the recipe, so here it is!

Ingredients: Preparation time: 30 minutes // Serves 6+ as a side

- 1½ cups short grain rice
- ½ cups dry roasted pistachio nuts, roughly chopped
- 1/4 cup dates, chopped
- 100g feta cheese, crumbled (optional)
- ½ pomegranate, seeds & juice
- 1 lemon, juiced & zest
- 3 tbs good quality olive oil
- ½ tsp honey (or agave nectar)
- Bunch of fresh mint leaves, roughly torn
- 1 tsp sumac

Method:

Cook the rice using your preferred method until al dente. Drain, rinse and set aside to cool (if serving the salad warm simply continue without allowing rice to cool).

Whisk the lemon juice, olive oil and honey or agave nectar together with a pinch of salt flakes & ground black pepper. Transfer the rice to a large bowl, add the pistachio nuts, dates feta (if using), lemon zest and toss to combine well with the dressing of lemon juice, olive oil and honey.

Scatter over the pomegranate seeds, a squeeze of pomegranate juice and the mint leaves, toss lightly and then dust with the sumac and a few extra mint leaves before serving. All the ingredients can be prepared ahead of time, simple toss together before service to keep the nuts crunchy and mint leaves fresh.
